During this 26 years good number of families, individuals and villages have been served and different community developments have been implemented with the support and financial assistance from different funding agencies, organizations, individuals etc. It is also remarkable that the tireless efforts of the dedicated staff in different project activities has enable to accomplished many of our projects. Without which we could not be able to reach the needy people and accomplished our objectives.



Some of the main activities taken up during the year 2022-2023.

1. SBI Gram Seva Project :

The SBI Gram Seva project which is an integrated rural development programme by adoption of villages and aiming to bring socio-economic change in the villages adopted five villages in Mamit district in Mizoram viz: N. Sabual, Phaizau, Suarhlip, Bawngva and Darlak have been successfully running in the villages with different activities such as digitalisation, quality education, primary health services, safe drinking water and sanitation, sustainable livelihood, empowerment of rural women and youth, environment protection, rural infrastructure, etc. The programme has shown incredible development and upliftment of the rural tribal people of which some are highlighted as follow:



(i) Piggery Farming

Under the piggery farming programme 130 families have been selected in N.Sabual, Bawngva, Darlak, Phaizau and Suarhiap villages for livelihood promotion of their family in pig breeding to increase income through piggery farming as well as developing the capacity of farmers on improved pig breeding practices. The objective is also to minimize the gap between the demand and the supply of pig and pork in the state which will sustain the economic condition of rural people since pig breeding has a very good scope for livelihood promotion in Mizoram. Selected farmers were provided piglets and pigsty construction materials.

**(ii) Construction Check dam for agricultural land :**

Check dam has been constructed in Phaizau village for irrigation purpose to supply water in the agricultural land which is the main source of agricultural productions in the village. The construction has been benefited by 130 families in the village. As a result their productions increased and earned good amount of profit. It is also worth mentioning that their productions are pure organic and good for consumption.



(iii) Distribution of power tiller and grass cutter:

The five adopted villages Bawngva, Darlak, Phaizau, North Sabual and Suarhliap were provided power tillers and grass cutters for more agriculture productions. Farmers of the villages are so excited to received the items as it would help them a lot in their cultivation of farming.



(iv) Distribution of Water Coolers in the schools :

Water coolers have been distributed in the primary and middle schools in Bawngva, Darlak, N. Sabual, Phaizau and Suarhliap villages for school going children. The main objective of distributing the water cooler in the schools is that students should get clean and hygienic drinking water during their school hours in the school.



(v) Scholarship to outstanding students :

Scholarships have been given to outstanding students from our five adopted villages. During the current year 25 selected students have been given scholarship for their outstanding performances.



(vi) Installation of safe drinking water :

Safe drinking water tanks have been installed in Bawngva, Phaizau, N. Sabual, Darlak and Suarhliap villages for public. With this initiative people in the villages get pure and safe drinking water regularly.



(vii) Distribution and installation of Dustbins:

Under cleanliness drive (swachh bhara mission) dustbins have been installed in five adopted villages. The rural people now maintained cleanliness in the villages which improves the clean environment and has a good impact on the programme.



(viii) Distribution of Sewing machines :

25 selected women entrepreneurs have been provided sewing machines for their income generation activities and self employment to start their own enterprises. With this support they have been earning good income for their families and are very happy.



(ix) Library

A School Library was set up in N. Sabual village Middle School where students can read books of their choice in their free time. Different books of children's need are kept in the Library in which school going children enjoy reading in their leisure time



(x) Skill Development Training

Different skill development trainings such as tailoring, mushroom cultivation, backing, goatery, piggery, handloom and handcraft, etc. have been taken up for income generation activities of the unemployed youth.



(xi) Entrepreneurship Development

A part from many other activities 10 selected beneficiaries from five villages was supported to start their own enterprise units for livelihood improvement and self employments. Out of which 3 were supported to start tea stalls, 3 grocery shops and 5 tailoring. They have been running smoothly their entrepreneurship earning good income out of it.



2. Handloom & Handicraft Training

Handloom and handicraft training is one of the main income generation activities. 150 unemployed youth have been provided training on handloom and handicraft. Many of them have set up their own production units in different places in Mizoram earning good income out of it.



3. Education

Education is one of the main activities of the organization. The organisation's educational institution Goodwill Foundation School is providing formal education to 450 students in the current year of which some of them are given education at free of cost without charging school fees.

4. Disaster Relief

Disaster relief have been provided in Zokhawthar, Zote, Thekte, Farkawn, Vaphai and Khankawn villages Champhai district, Mizoram with financial support from Jumma Net, Japan. Village and community leaders participated in the distribution of relief materials distributed to 1806 beneficiaries.



5. SBI Sanjeevani – Clinic on Wheels

A project named *SBI Sanjeevani – Clinic on wheels* funded by SBI Foundation for doorstep rural health services to provide primary, preventive, diagnostic and referral

health services of the people in the un-served tribal areas of 20 selected villages in Churachandpur district, Manipur taken up successfully. Under the programme 12,570 people have been impacted with different medical services.
