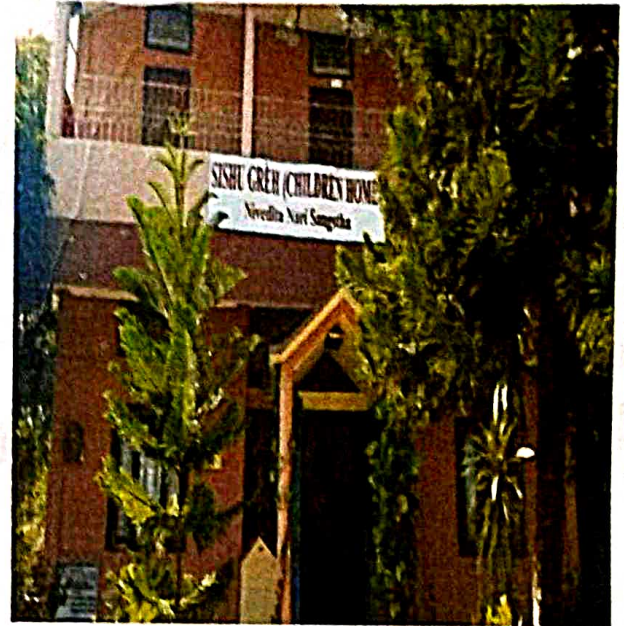


SPECIALIZE ADOPTION AGENCY

The Specialized Adoption Agency run by NNS and sanctioned by Central Adoption Resource Authority, New Delhi, to provide in-country and inter-country adoption of children who have been declared legally free by Child Welfare Committee (CWC).


Prospective Adoptive Parents (PAPs) if willing to take adoption can apply through online in CARINGS. Pre-Counselling is required before applying in CARINGS. Between the year 2020-2021, 9 children and 3 PAPs have been registered in our SAA.

During the year 2020-2021, 2 numbers of children were placed in for In-country adoption and 2 numbers of children were restored to their biological parents.

CRÈCHE CENTRE

Nivedita Nari Sangstha (NNS) provided facilities to 25 children in the age group of 0-6 years. The Creche Centre workers provide primary education, monitors health and nutrition, conduct games for children and also looks after the immunization and growth monitoring of children. The crèche centre run under National Crèche scheme provides crèche facilities to children of working and ailing mothers in rural and urban areas of Silchar.


Due to Covid-19 pandemic, the children are provided relief, masks, sanitizers, etc. Due to Covid-19, children are not coming to the centre but we are providing the facilities to the children at their home.

CHILD CARE INSTITUTE



In Utsorjona Balika Greh (CCI), the children are provided with immediate shelter, basic care and other essential facilities, etc. This project was officially started from 2011, but this project was voluntarily managed by the founder Mrs. Diba Roy till 2019. In the year 2019, the project was financially sanctioned by the Government.

Children in our Utsorjona Balika Greh are coming from three districts such as Cachar, Karimganj and Hailakandi. Since, 2011 to 2021 more than 130 beneficiaries have been benefitted from Utsorjona Balika Greh.




Children who are given custody by CWC for long term placement in our children home are enrolled in Government Schools and are also provided with co-curricular trainings; and children who are admitted for short time placement are provided with Non- formal education by the organization's staffs.

6. International Women's Day:



12. Gandhi Jayanti:


