SANATAN UNNAYAN SANGSTHA, a Barak Valley based Non Government No Profit Voluntary Organisation registered under Societies Registration Act XXI of 1860 in Cachar, Assam since Nov., 2006. The Organization is serving the downtrodden, disadvantaged group of rural and other vulnerable people spread over three districts of south Assam viz. Cachar, Karimganj & Hailakandi.

Motto: *Serve among the weaker sections of the Society.*

VISION: A Happy Society - where everyone lives with self-respect, dignity and pride.

MISSION: Following are the mission of Sanatan Unnayan Sangstha:

- To provide cost effective, sustainable people- friendly health and education for women, children & adolescents of weaker sections of Society.
- To provide employment to unemployed youth & women of the disadvantaged sections of Society through agriculture and other engagements.
- To provide pre, during & post disaster needs of the Society.

ACTIVITY DETAILS OF SANATAN UNNAYAN SANGSTHA (SUS):

1. Cultural:

i) CELEBRATION AND OBSERVATION OF NATIONAL, INTERNATIONAL DAYS AND WEEKS:

Sanatan Unnayan Sangstha celebrates Independence Day, Republic Day, International Day of Yoga, World Environment Day with colourful activities in Narsingpur area and Elgin areas every year with different kinds of activities including flag hosting, discussion & meeting among Self Help Group members, door to door visits among villagers and distributing chocolate etc. It has been supported by Nehru Yuva Kendra Cachar and the ant, Chirang.

It has also celebrated International Women Day at Chengduar Bagan of Cachar district, more than 150 women including man also participated.

ii) FOLK CULTURE PRESERVATION PROGRAM:

To strengthen, spreading and propagating traditional folk culture among people of our society, Sanatan Unnayan Sangstha is supporting, encouraging different adolescent and youth groups to present Folk Art, Ai-Gaan, Dhamail, Charak Dance (Folk culture of Barak Valley) different ways at Berabak, Elgin Grant and Kukubari village areas during different events of SUS and also beyond the programs.

2. Economic:

i) SELF EMPLOYMENT GENERATION PROGRAM:

To employ unemployed youth from very poor families who are not able to start their own business or struggling for developing the livelihood due to financial problems; SUS is providing financial assistance to youths to start their own venture or for taking any livelihood activity to become self employed. During this financial year Sangstha has done follow up the self-employed youth and done survey at shut Chencoorie tea garden for interested needy youth for self-employment.

Moreover, Sangstha is not only providing financial assistance to the downtrodden but also encouraging, counseling and training the youths to become entrepreneur and self employed.

ii) FORMATION OF SELF-HELP GROUP (SHG):

To increase income and saving of the poor, marginalized people of shut Chencoorie Tea Garden the Sangstha is forming SHG by the support of Paul Hamlyn Foundation, UK. Having formed the SHG, these are linking with ASRLM, Cachar. It also building the capacities of SHG members on Pancha Sutra and Dasasutra.

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Till now, the Sangstha has formed 54 SHGs including 18 formed by CRPs this financial year and has linked 19 SHGs with ASRLM, Cachar; Krishi Vigyan Kendra, Cachar; Department of Agriculture, Animal Husbandry and Veterinary, Panchayat and Rural Development, Public Health Engineering of Government of Assam; Nehru Yuva Kendra, Cachar; NABARD, Cachar and others.

iii) EXPOSURE VISIT CUM TRAININGS OF SHG MEMBERS, CRP:

To improve capacity and increase motivation of the SHG members the Sangstha has conducted exposure visit under Reducing Vulnerabilities of Families in Shut Tea Gardens of Assam (Red Families Project) at Mongaldoi Cluster of SeSTA, Guwahati by the Support of Paul Hamlyn Foundation, UK where 20 members of SHG and 04 staff, 03 volunteers have participated.

iv) TRAINING OF SHG MEMBERS:

To develop skills of the SHG members 04 training of SHG members have been conducted by the Support of Paul Hamlyn Foundation, UK under Red Families Project where 120 members of SHG and 18 staff, 07 volunteers have participated. Training conducted on nutrition garden, sex gender equality and women empowerment, importance of livestock in the rural livelihood in the context of Cachar district, organic manure and development of nutrition garden, SHGs' books of account maintenance, loan management and SHGs' documentation, importance of livestock, SHG management and importance, VO management and importance, Strengthening skill, Capacity building of SHG members on livelihood activity and nutrition garden activity etc.

v) TRAINING OF STAFF AND VOLUNTEERS:

To develop capacities of 03 staff and 02 volunteers, training of staff on Manage and motivate to SHGs, Gender Social Analysis, Natural Resource and Group management, Documentation Process and Record maintenance, Strengthening Knowledge and Field Visit with Practical on Livestock and Nutrition Garden, Community Participation and Development, Live Stock Managements, SHG Management, Nutrition Garden Management have been conducted at Elgin Cluster of the SUS, Elgin Grant village by the support of Paul Hamlyn Foundation, UK under Red Families Project.

vi) EXPOSURE VISIT OF STAFF AND YOUTH VOLUNTEERS:

To motivate and acquire knowledge on SHGs, the SUS had conducted an exposure visit cum training of 04 staff and 02 youth volunteers at Mongaldoi Cluster of SeSTA, Guwahati. In the exposure visit the participants learned Natural Resource Management, Proper document maintenance of SHGs, Key

knowledge regarding livelihood, Nutrition Garden Process and Support system, Livestock process and support system.

vii) NUTRITION GARDEN AND LIVESTOCK DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM:

To generate income, increase nutrition intake among 50 SHG members, the SUS had given 300 ducklings among 15 members of 07 SHGs; 10 goat among 10 members, 05 Lemon saplings each among 25 members, 04 Papia each among 25 members, 05 Orange each among 25 members, 02 Litchi each among 25 members, 02 Coconut among 25 members, 02 Mango among 25 members, 02 Daal Chini among 25 families, 100 gm Radish among 25 members, 100 Spinach among 25 families, 100 cucumber among 25 families, 100 Muster beans, 20 gm Bringle among 25 members, 10 gm Pumpkin among 25 families, 25 Long beans among 25 members, 100 gm Bitter guard.

viii) BASELINE SURVEY AND HEMOGLOBIN TEST:

To know present status like income, nutrition intake by projected families, sapling living status of nutritious plants and livestock the SUS has been conducting survey time to time. The Survey helps to take remedial measure and planning for future.

We have also conducted hemoglobin test of 350 SHG members to know their hemoglobin level for better health.

ix) PROMOTION OF DAIRY FARMER PRODUCER ORGANISATION:

Binnakandi area, there is a dairy farmer producer organization named Barak Dairy which is hand holding by the Sangstha for the improvement of milk men or dairy farmers. So, the Sangstha has been organizing awareness camps on dairy farming by door-to-door visits, making them support of different kinds like improving capacities of farmers, convergence with the Government schemes, training like Individual Business Plan, dairy farming, rearing of cattle etc. It is supported by the NABARD, Assam since April 2022.

Till now, Barak Dairy has 403 members, 280 shareholders, collecting 225 litters milks per day and preparing little paneer, ghee, curd, milk and selling these.

x) BEST COMMUNITY RESOURCE PERSON (CRP) AWARD:

To motivate and involve in grassroots works the CRPs of shut Chencoorie tea garden and it's nearby areas, 05 CRPs who has been trained under Red Families Project and the CRPs who involved for improving other SHGs, formed new SHGs, involved in community works have been awarded for motivating them and also involving in grass root works.

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3. Educational:

i) IMPROVING LEARNING OUTCOMES OF THE STUDENTS PROGRAM:

To improve learning outcomes of 300 students of 10 lower primary schools namely 637 No. Elgin Grant LPS, Mangalpur LPS, 664 No. Kukubari LPS, 1112 No. Chencoorie LPS, 1005 No. Chencoorie LPS, 951 No. Nutun Dhakin Kanchanpur LPS, 517 No. Chengduar LPS, Chengduar Bagan Purnaline LPS, Chengduar Bagan MES, Pinthol Model MES of shut Chencoorie tea garden and Chengduar Bagan areas under Red Families Project, the Sangstha has been conducted baseline survey (01), remedial classes (10 Centres), ASER tests (03 Times), home evaluation, home visit, capacity building training (01 Training), School Management Committee training (06 Training), monthly guardians meet (40), exposure visit of SMC Members (06 Times) guardians and exposure visit of staff (01 Time) etc by the support of Paul Hamlyn Foundation, UK. Additionally, the remedial classes had been conducting within the schools after school hours.

ii) REMEDIAL CLASSES PROGRAM:

To improve learning outcomes of 300 lower primary students of 10 Government lower primary schools of Algin Cluster area, the Sangstha is providing support to 10 remedial centres by the support of Paul Hamlyn Foundation, UK. 09 Remedial centres are running after school at the school premises and 01 Centre at Community constructed remedial centre. The remedial classes have been conducting using TLMs, Learning through play method, participatory method and child centric method. Remedial classes are conducted by 12 Youth Volunteers who are trained from the ant, Chirang and also trained by Children/ Remedial Educators of Red Families Project (Phase-I).

Till now, 90% (270) students learning outcomes have improved and 30% (90) have reached to age-appropriate classes.

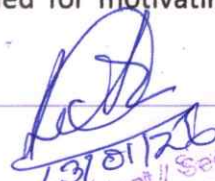
iii) BEST TEACHER AWARD:

To motivate the teachers of 10 Government schools of shut Chencoorie tea garden and it's nearby areas, 01 Government teacher from every school who has applied participatory method, child centric method, learning through play method and used TLM during teaching has been awarded to motivating them.

iv) BEST YOUTH VOLUNTEER (YV) AWARD:

To motivate and involve in community works the YV of shut Chencoorie tea garden and it's nearby areas, 03 CRPs who has been trained under Red Families Project and the YVs who involved for improving education, sports and also involved in community works have been awarded for motivating them and involving in community works.

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v) BEST SMC MEMBER AWARD:

To motivate and involve SMC member of 10 Government schools of shut Chencoorie tea garden and it's nearby areas, 10 SMC members who has been trained under Red Families Project and the SMC members who involved for improving education, using TLM and also involved in community development have been awarded for motivating them for child centric, participatory learning, using TLM in schools and involving in community works.

4. Social:

i) MENTAL ILLNESS TREATMENT IN ASSAM (MITA) PROGRAM:

To create awareness on mental illness and to treat the mentally ill poor patients in Cachar, Karimganj and Hailakandi districts, the Sangstha is implementing MITA program in Cachar district in collaboration of the IDeA, the ant, Chirang. In this regard, the Sangstha has organised awareness camps among different locations of Cachar district and its office premises. It has been organizing Metal Health Camps at the premises of Sanatan Unnayan Sangstha, Berabak Pt-I by the contribution of mentally ill people.

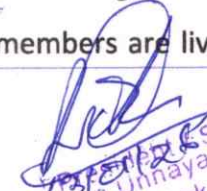
Till now, **718** Patients including 91 patients in this financial year have been registered under Mental Health Camp organised at SUS Head Office, Berabak Pt-I. On 03rd Sunday of every month Mental Health Camp is organised by the Sangstha. More than 646 (90%) patients' improvement has been noticed.

ii) STOP DOMESTIC VIOLENCE II- AVAHAN (Against Violence at Home Act Now!):

To improve women rights, dignity, peace and progress of families a project has been implementing at Algin area which includes 09 habitations named Merua Grant, Kukubari, Algin Grant, Chengdur Basti, Chengduar Bangn, Chenduar Uttar Basti, Kanchanpur, Bualjur, Chencoorie Bagan of Tapang Block and Narsingpur area by the Sangstha since 1st October 2020. It has been conducting the following activities- Awareness on Gender Domestic Violence with Response Group (2 Training), SHG members (2 Training), Children (2 Training); Capacity Building of project staff (01 Training), Baseline Survey (1), Survivor Support, Legal Aid Camps (12), Legal Aid Centre (1), Campaign on Violence against Women (2), Individual Counseling (46 Domestic Violence Survivor), Family Counseling, Legal Counseling (20 Domestic Violence Survivor), Emergency support, Leal support (20 Domestic Violence Survivor), Livelihood support (01 Domestic Violence Survivor), Meeting and Training with Response Group, Meeting with key leaders, Training on sex gender and domestic violence with VO members (02 Training) and students (02 Training) etc under Red Families Project which was supported by Paul Hamlyn Foundation, UK.

Till now, 159 Domestic Violence including 46 in this financial year have been registered in Legal Aid Centre. 54 (33%) Survivors domestic violence have been solves and family members are living in peace,

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dignity and respect. 20 Survivors have been supported on Court/ Legal Support, 01 Survivors on Livelihood, 02 Survivors on Emergency Medical Support.

iii) Sports Development Initiative:

To improve mental, physical, emotional and social health of children and youth of shut Chencoorie tea garden and nearby areas the Sangstha has taken sports development initiative by the support of Pual Hamlyn Foundation, UK in 10 habitations of the projected areas. Due to the initiative the children, youth have been given training on physical exercise, yoga and sports. In the projected areas, Sangstha is also promoting Frisbee sports and the players have been participated in Northeast Frisbee Tournament in Chirang and also won 02 games and a medal- "Best Players of the Tournament" by Shri Noren Sudra. The players and trainers are giving training by the ant, Chirang in the initial stage and now Ultimate Frisbee Federation of India.

In 10 Remedial classes Frisbee is practicing by 300 children. Every Sunday the youth practice Frisbee at 03 locations named Kanchanpur, Chengduar Bagan, Chencoorie Bagan rural play fields and training is given by Miss Rumi Juria, Miss Nisha Juria and Mr. Sujit Chasa.

5. Community:

(i) Cloth for Work (CFW) Program:

To develop communities in rural and tea garden areas in the fields of roads, canals, play fields, bands etc the Sangstha is working with villagers/ community. The villagers have repaired roads, constructed drains, constructed bamboo fencings, constructed Bamboo bridges, constructed Innovative boats etc. When the villagers complete the targeted works, a Cloth for Work kits are given to the participants which is supported by the Goonj, New Delhi.

During the financial year the Sangstha have reconstructed 06 roads at Paharthol, Paladhar, Sonaipar, Megna Barantor, Halghat, Abdullapar of Sribhumi district; 05 Hillayatilla, Bairabpur, Bairabpur Part-I, Talkarghat, Tarapur under Kalain Development Block; Jatinga, Chengduar, Pinthol of Tapang Development Block of Cachar district; Tapang Part-I, Tapangline-II of Algapur Development Block of Hailakandi district and 14000 plantation at Bajantipur, Kanchanpur, Bajantipur Part-I, Bajantipur Part-III, Nutun Kanchanpur of Silchar Block; Algin Grant, Chencoorie Grant, Chencoorie Bagan of Tapang Development Block of Cachar district etc.

01 Community Hall had been repaired by 50 people of Chengduar tea garden by their own for conducting remedial classes at the hall.

ii) School to School (S2S) Program:

During the financial year the Sangstha have supported 200 students of 10 lower primary schools by giving books, pens, pencils, bags, fluxes, geometry boxes etc at Chengduar Bagan Purna Line LPS, Chengduar Bagan MES, 617 No. Algin LPS, 1005 No. Chencoorie LPS, 1112 No. Chencoorie TE LPS, 517 No. Chengduar LPS, 664 No. Kukubari LPS, Pinthol Model LPS of Tapang Development Block and Mangalpur LPS, 951 No. Nutun Kanchanpur LPS of Silchar Development Block.

01 Carrom Board, 01 Bag TLM and 01 Bag toys had been given separately at 1005 No. Chencoorie LPS, Purnaline LPS, 517 No. Chengduar LPS, Chengduar MES of Tapang Development Block and 951 No. Nutun Dakhin Kanchanpur LPS of Silchar Development Block of Cachar district.

vi) Not Just a Piece of Cloth (NJPC) Program:

To improve health and hygiene of women in tea gardens areas of shut Chencoorie tea gardens & its nearby areas of Cachar district and Burnie Brease tea garden of Hailakandi district, Sangstha is giving awareness to women about personal hygiene and use of low-cost sanitary pad, prepared by cotton clothes; which is supported by the Goonj, New Delhi. An ATM Pad has been running by community volunteers at Burnie Brease tea garden.

Till now, 1500 sanitary pad have been collected from the ATM Pad and using by women at Burnie Brease tea garden.

vii) Enhancing Resilience among tea garden workers of Barak Valley, Assam Program:

Enhancing Resilience among tea garden workers of Barak Valley, Assam Program to provide knowledge on entitlement of tea garden works and help them apply for safe motherhood schemes like Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana, Sukanya Sambriddhi Yojana, Janani Suraksha Yojana and Wage compensation. Para Legal Volunteers (PLVs) are trained to file right to information, how to file complains on different socio economic and community issues, and also help the communities for applying different Government schemes. PLVs have been made community leaders for helping their communities. This program is executing in 02 districts namely Cachar and Hailakandi, which is supported by Nazdeek, US. The project was implemented across five key tea estates in the region: Derby T.E., Chengduar T.E., Paloi T.E., Chenkuri T.E., and Burnie Braes T.E.

To strengthen coordination and create collaborative platforms for dialogue, 05 (five) stakeholder meetings were organized—one in each tea garden. These meetings brought together community members, local stakeholders, and PLVs, helping to foster a shared understanding of the challenges faced by the tea garden workers and generating local solutions. A total of 150 members and stakeholders from the

local communities participated during the meetings along with resource persons from various government departments like Social Welfare Department, District Health Department, Social Welfare Department etc.

A total of 42 community consultations were held on all project areas during a year where approximately 850 participants joined the meeting along with local stakeholders like ASHA, Angandwadi Workers, staff of National Rural Health Mission etc. The main objective of the meeting was to bring out the challenges/ issues faced by the community members.

05 Capacity buildings have been conducted for 08 PLVs to make them aware about different Government schemes, filing complains on different socio economic and community issues to make them better community leaders.

Through the direct support of PLVs and the project team, over 90 beneficiaries successfully applied for and accessed various government schemes. These beneficiaries, many of them were previously unaware of their rights, now have access to services that can substantially improve their health, economic stability, and overall quality of life.

6. Disaster:

i) DISASTER RELIEF AND RESPONSE PROGRAM:

Barak Valley i.e. Cachar, Karimganj and Hailakandi districts of Assam had faced flood every years, which made people to left their homes to stay outside in safe place like high areas, Government, private and community premises. People were unbale to meet day to day need of their life like food, shelter, cloth. Seeing the pathetic condition of people, the SUS had taken initiatives to support the needy people. It had given essential commodities like rice, daal, master oil, soybean potatoes, medicines, medicines etc to flood affected people. It had also conducted post flood activities to develop the rural flood affected communities. It had been supported by Individual donors; Goonj, New Delhi; and others. It had also provided support to mentally ill people by providing medicines to their door steps.

After flood it had supported 460 families through Cloth for Work Program of Goonj, New Delhi at Burnie Brease tea garden areas of Hailakandi, Bazarghat areas of Sribhumi and shut Chencoorie tea garden of Cahcar districts.

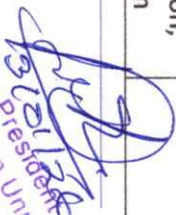

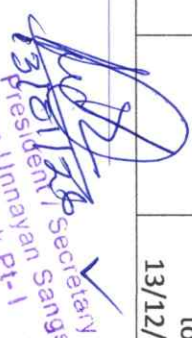
