Since the time of its inception till date, the organization has engaged itself in many programs and schemes with the support of Government agencies and local administrative support. The programs and schemes which the organization has been part of till date has benefited many downtrodden and marginalized populations of Barak Valley in Assam, in the field of Education, Health, Women empowerment, and nutritional needs of lactating women and children. The Organisation is registered as a non – profit society, having registration number RS/CA/243/43 of 1997-98, under the Societies Registration Act of 1860. Our organization's mission is to focus on early childhood development programs aimed at addressing health, nutrition and the development needs of young children, pregnant and nursing mothers. In almost 20 years of its operation, Nivedita has been able to extend its services to major districts of lower Assam through its different in-house and Field programs, benefitting the vulnerable and underprivileged women and children in the area. UTSORJONA BALIKA GREH(CCI)

In Utsorjona Balika Greh (CCI), the children are provided with immediate shelter, basic care, and other essential facilities. This project was officially started in 2011 and it was voluntarily managed by the founder Mrs. Diba Roy till 2019. Child Welfare Committee (CWC) looks after the issuance of custody of children and Nivedita Nari Sangstha (NNS) provides immediate shelter, food, and education along with fulfilling their other basic needs. NNS looks after the overall development of children with a special focus on their personality development. Children who are given custody by CWC for long-term placement in our children's home are enrolled in Government Schools and are also provided with co-curricular training, and children who are admitted for short time placement are provided with Non formal education by the organization's staff. In Oct 2019, the project was financially sanctioned and it received a grant-in-aid from the Ministry of Women & Child Development. Details of the children admitted in 2021 Utsorjona Balika Greh Nivedita Nari Sangstha.10 Children from three districts such as Cachar, Karimganj, and Hailakandi come to stay here. Keeping the best interest of children in mind, our organization works towards establishing a safe and sustainable life for the victim girls.

DETAILS OF THE CHILDREN ADMITTED IN THE CHLD CARE INSTITUTION SPECIALZIED ADPOTION AGENCY

In 2004, our organization took an initiative to stop illegal adoptions in Barak Valley and became a Specialized Adoption Agency (SAA) sanctioned by the Central Adoption Resource Authority (CARA), New Delhi. Being a Specialized Adoption Agency, NNS is responsible for the care, protection, and well-being of every child in our agency. The Specialized Adoption Agency is run by NNS and sanctioned by Central Adoption Resource Authority, New Delhi, to provide in-country and inter-country adoption of children who have been declared legally free by the Child Welfare Committee (CWC). Prospective Adoptive Parents (PAPs) if willing to take adoption can apply online in CARINGS. Pre-Counselling is required before applying in CARINGS.

ANNUAL REPORT OF PROGRAMMES HELD AT NIVEDITA NARI SANGSTHA (2025–26)

1. International Yoga Day (21 June 2025)

International Yoga Day was observed with the participation of CCI children, staff, and guests. A yoga session conducted by trained instructors promoted physical fitness, mental well-being, and healthy living.

2. Independence Day (15 August 2025)

The celebration began with flag hoisting by Chief Guest Col. Anil Kumar Verma, followed by the National Anthem. Patriotic cultural performances were presented by CCI children, and CRPF personnel attended the event. The programme promoted patriotism, unity, and national pride.

3. POSHAN BHI PADHAI BHI Training (18–30 August 2025)

The training programme for ICDS Silchar Project was conducted in four batches. It focused on child nutrition, growth monitoring, ECCE, and holistic child development, enhancing the skills of Anganwadi workers and staff.

4. National Sports Day (29–31 August 2025)

National Sports Day was celebrated in honour of Major Dhyan Chand. Various indoor and outdoor games were organized, encouraging physical fitness, teamwork, discipline, and sportsmanship among children.

5. Vigilance Awareness Week (27 October – 2 November 2025)

Various activities such as quiz, poster making, slogan writing, painting, and rangoli competitions were conducted to promote honesty, integrity, and awareness against corruption. The programme concluded with prize distribution.

6. National Girl Child Day (24 January 2026)

The programme highlighted the importance of girls' rights, education, safety, and empowerment. Speeches and cultural performances were organized, followed by a vote of thanks and sweet distribution.

7. Republic Day (26 January 2026)

Republic Day was celebrated with flag hoisting, patriotic songs, speeches, and cultural programmes. The event promoted national unity and pride among staff and children.

8. Rabindra Jayanti (7 May 2026)

Rabindra Jayanti was observed to commemorate Rabindranath Tagore's birth anniversary. Children presented poems, Rabindra Sangeet, and dance performances, paying tribute to his literary and cultural contributions.

9. Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose Birth Anniversary (23 January 2026)

The birth anniversary of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose was celebrated with floral tributes, speeches, patriotic songs, poems, and cultural performances. The programme inspired children to follow the values of patriotism, courage, and dedication to the nation.
